



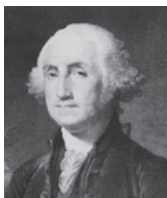
President Matching Game

Theodore
Roosevelt

1. Our 20th president was a college professor before becoming a brigadier general. He was elected president by a margin of only 10,000 popular votes, and died after being shot at a railroad station only 100 days after becoming president.



George
Washington

2. As a war hero, and the first president, he is the most famous of all the founding fathers. He valued all human life and freed his slaves. Surprisingly, he didn't go to school past the age of 15.



John F.
Kennedy

3. Our eighth president was the first to be born in the United States of America. He took his four years salary, \$100,000, in one lump sum at the end of his term. He and his wife spoke Dutch at home. After one term as president, he tried three times, unsuccessfully, to be reelected.



Martin
Van Buren

4. He was the first president to serve in the U.S. Navy. In 1961 he established the Peace Corps. He was the only president to win a Pulitzer Prize, and the only one to appoint his brother to a cabinet post. In 1963, he was killed by an assassin in Dallas, Texas. At 43 years old, he was the youngest president to be elected, and at 46, he was the youngest to die.



James
Garfield

5. As a child, this president had asthma and was too sickly to go to school. He had a photographic memory, and could read one page in the time it took most to read a sentence. The teddy bear is named after him. He was awarded the Nobel Peace Prize in 1906 for helping to the end the Russo-Japanese War.
