


President Matching Game

- 1. Before becoming our 40th president, he was a Hollywood actor and made more than 50 movies. Moments after being inaugurated, 52 American hostages in Iran were released. He nominated Sandra Day O'Connor, the first woman to serve on the Supreme Court. He was 77 years old when he left office, making him the oldest president.
- 2. Our 23rd president once made 140 different speeches in 30 days. When he moved into the White House, it was in a dilapidated state and plans were made to build a new house. His last daughter, Elizabeth, was younger than his four grandchildren.
- 3. Our 33rd president first served as vice president under Roosevelt. His Fair Deal program extended Social Security to 10 million people, and raised minimum wage to 75¢ an hour. He dropped the first atomic bombs, killing more than 200,000 people and ending World War II.
- 4. Our 13th president had no formal education. He was vice president under Taylor. He and his wife installed the first library, bathtub, and stove in the White House. He couldn't read Latin, and refused an honorary degree from Oxford saying he shouldn't accept a degree that he couldn't read.
- 5. Our ninth president served only 30 days, but gave the longest inaugural address one hour, 45 minutes. He was the first president to die in office. He was inaugurated on March 4, 1841, contracted pneumonia in late March, died in the White House on April 4. He was the only president to study to be a doctor.
