- 1. He graduated from Harvard Law School in 1845. In 1880 he visited San Francisco, becoming the first president to visit the West Coast. His wife, known as "Lemonade Lucy," refused to serve alcohol in the White House. He had the first telephone installed in the White House by Alexander Graham Bell.
- 2. Our 32nd president launched the "New Deal" measures, and revived the banking industry. He ratified the 21st Amendment, ending prohibition. In 1935 the Social Security Act and the Works Progress Administration (WPA) was passed. He was the first president to appear on television.
- 3. The 39th president graduated from the U.S. Naval Academy in 1946 and signed treaties stopping the U.S. operation of the Panama Canal. In 1979 he signed a bill creating the Department of Education. He was the first president born in a hospital.
- 4. The 11th president expanded the U.S. in 1848 through a treaty with Mexico ending a two year war and taking control over what is now Arizona, California, Colorado, Nevada, New Mexico, Utah and Wyoming. Before the use of anesthetics and antiseptic, he had a gallstone operation at age 17.
- 5. Our 28th president was the governor of New Jersey in 1910. Helped the U.S. buy the Virgin Islands from Denmark. In 1917, he declared war on Germany. In 1918, an armistice ending World War I was signed. In 1920, the 19th Amendment, giving women the right to vote, was ratified.
