

The seventh president of the United States had no formal education. He was elected from Tennessee to the House of Representatives. He was the only president to serve in the Revolutionary War and the War of 1812, and the only president to have been a prisoner of war. Wounded in a duel at age 39, he had a bullet lodged near his heart his whole life.

The second president of the United States was a direct descendant of pilgrims who landed at Plymouth Rock in 1620. He and Thomas Jefferson were the only presidents to sign the Declaration of Independence, and they both died on its 50th anniversary. He lived longer than any other president, he was almost 91.

The third president graduated from the College of William and Mary in 1762. He was Secretary of State under Washington, and vice president under Adams. His library of 6,000 books was purchased for \$23,950 and formed the basis of the Library of Congress.

This was the only president to serve two non-consecutive terms. He lost the 1888 election for second term to Benjamin Harrison, despite having a larger popular vote. Since he was the sole supporter of his family during the Civil War, he paid someone else to take his place.

The 28th president is the only president to earn a Ph.D. In 1913, he held the first presidential press conference, and afterward met with the press twice a week. His second wife, Edith, was a great-granddaughter of Pocahontas. An avid golfer, he used black golf balls when playing in the snow.
