

Use a Comma to Indicate a Pause

Commas indicate a small break, separating words, clauses, or ideas within a single sentence. A comma often indicates an instance when a speaker would pause in speech.

Insert a comma to indicate a pause in sentences with the following elements:	
interjections	Oh my, this is the most exquisite New York cheesecake in the world.
appositives	The summer solstice, sometimes called midsummer, is the longest day of the year.
direct addresses	Kendra, will you recite your poem at the showcase tomorrow night?
introductory phrases or clauses	With a backpack full of supplies, Eamonn started on his six-month hike of the Appalachian Trail.
