Valley Forge

Valley Forge is the site of the Continental Army's camp during the winter of 1777 during the American Revolution. Armies often sought out places to camp for winter since back then it was hard to fight under snowy conditions. General George Washington needed a secure location for his troops to stay that winter, and chose Valley Forge. His soldiers' time at Valley Forge is often considered the turning point of the Revolutionary War. While they stayed at the camp, they were trained by a former Prussian officer named Friedrich von Stuben, who helped them leave the camp in the summer with new fighting techniques that helped them win the war and American's independence.
