

Who or Whom?

Sometimes it's hard to tell whether to use **who** or **whom** in a sentence.

Remember: "who" is a **subject pronoun** (just like I, he, she, they, and we), and "whom" is an **object pronoun** (just like me, him, her, them, and us).
