

WINTER HYPERBOLE

Hyperbole is using very extreme or unrealistic descriptions to talk about something. These descriptions are usually not possible in real life. Hyperbole can show strong emotions or create humor. It is often associated with exaggeration. Look at this example.



It's so windy that you could send a letter just by tossing it in the air!

The hyperbole suggests that the wind could carry and deliver the letter where you want it to. We know this is unrealistic because wind often moves wildly. However, this exaggeration tells us that it is very windy and something, like a letter, could blow away in the wind.
