Write with a Purpose!

Writers have different purposes for writing, and these purposes impact both what they write and how they write it.

Sometimes a writer might write a story to **entertain** the reader. The purpose might be to make the reader laugh or enjoy an exciting story.

If a writer wants to **persuade** a reader, the writer wants to convince the reader to change an opinion or act in a certain way.

When writers want to **explain** with their writing, they want to help the reader understand a specific topic or situation.

Purpose: Persuade




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2. Reader: Grandmother

Purpose: Explain



3. Reader: Younger brother or sister

Background: The younger brother or sister wants to hear an exciting story.

Purpose: Entertain



4. Reader: Student

Background: The student is interested in learning more about an animal.

Purpose: Explain
