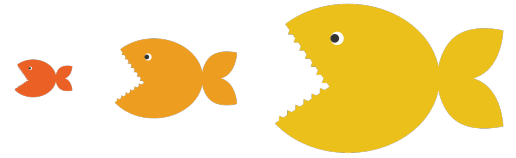


# Writing Comparative and Superlative Adjectives: Mixed Review

**Comparative adjectives** compare two nouns. **Superlative adjectives** compare more than two nouns. When we write these adjectives, sometimes we have to follow special rules.



Adjective		Comparative	Superlative
One syllable	fast	<b>Add -er:</b> faster	<b>Add -est:</b> fastest
Ends in silent e	nice	<b>Add -r:</b> nicer	<b>Add -st:</b> nicest
Short vowel CVC word	big	<b>Double the last consonant and add -er:</b> bigger	<b>Double the last consonant and add -est:</b> biggest
Ends in -y	happy	<b>Remove -y and add -ier:</b> happier	<b>Remove -y and add -iest:</b> happiest
Two or more syllables	famous	<b>Add more:</b> more famous	<b>Add most:</b> most famous
Irregular	good	<b>Change the spelling:</b> better	<b>Change the spelling:</b> best
